His remarkable bravery has been evident throughout his participation in disaster rescue operations across Nepal. This year alone, he successfully recovered 11 bodies from 23 incidents, and to date, he has rescued over 20 people and recovered more than 70 bodies. Additionally, he has contributed to disaster risk reduction through his involvement in several simulation exercises.

Born on 2046/06/08 B.S. in Narayan Municipality 2, Dailekh, Mr. Bhandari is the son of Karna Bahadur Bhandari and Pushpa Devi Bhandari. He is married to Indira Karki Bhandari, and they have two sons, aged 9 years and 8 months. These efforts are aimed at maintaining peace, preventing lawlessness and combating crime across the country.

To fulfill its objectives, the Department focuses on three main strategic priorities: operational excellence, operational readiness and operational development. These strategies are essential in ensuring sustainable peace and security within Nepal's internal security framework. The department is playing a pivotal role in maintaining stability and safety.

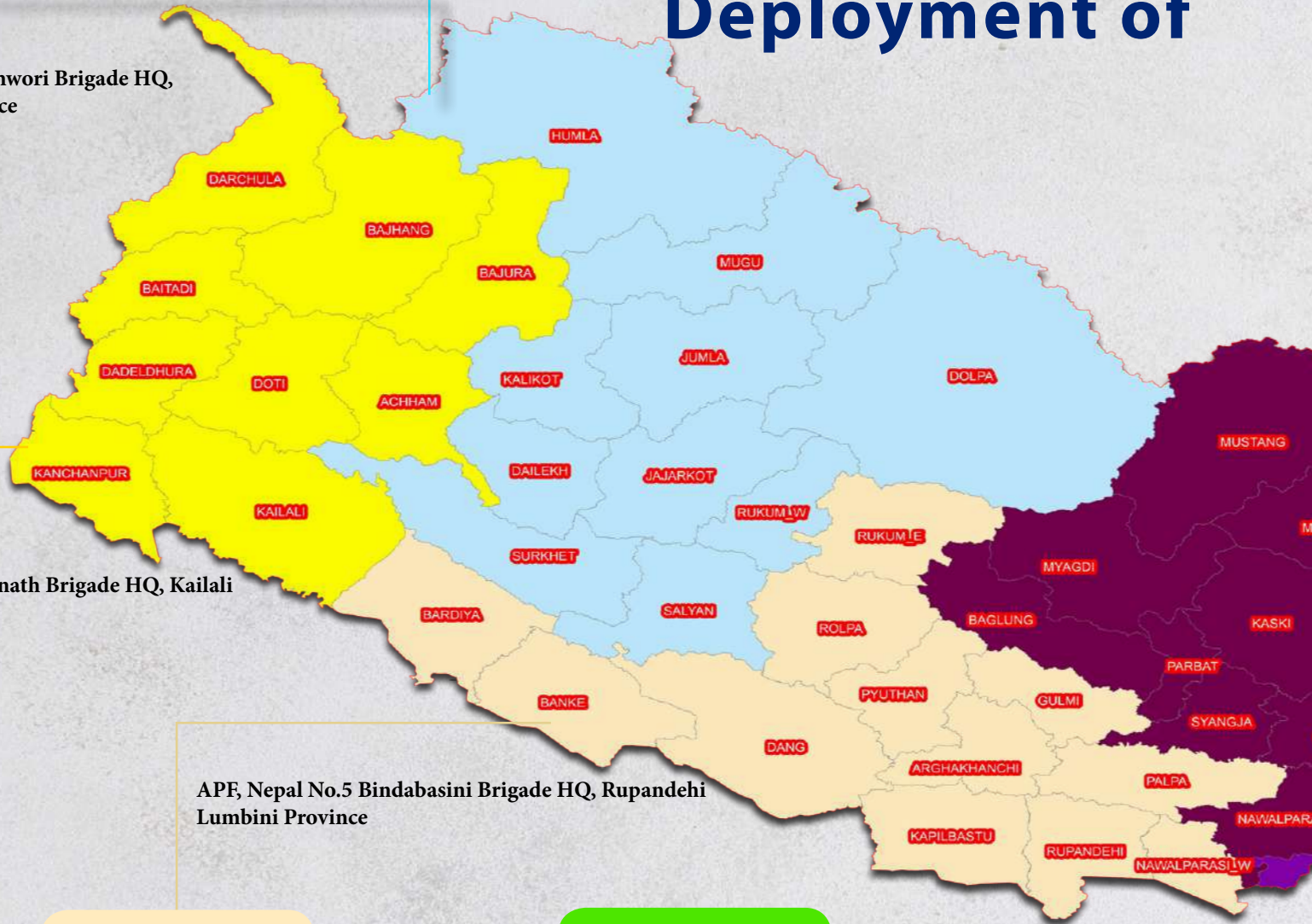

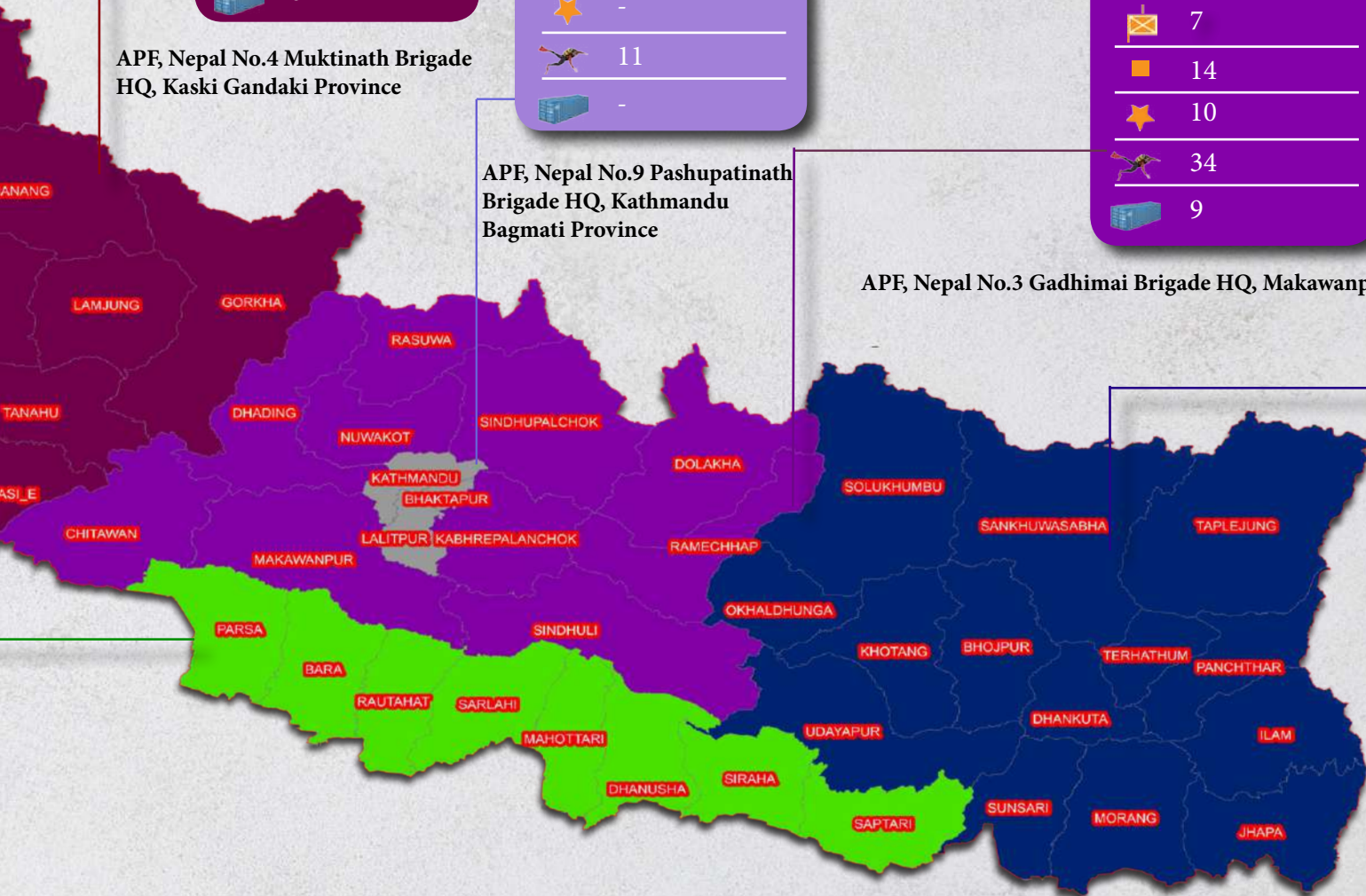

# BORDER SECURITY DEPARTMENT

One of the key responsibilities of the Armed Police Force, Nepal is to ensure the security of the country's borders. To fulfill this duty, the APF has strategically stationed its personnel along Nepal's borders, where they actively enforce security measures. The Border Security Department is tasked with overseeing all border-related operations such as protecting border pillars and boundary markers, controlling illegal cross-border activities, combating human trafficking and preserving the territorial integrity of Nepal.

In response to the growing challenges posed by transnational crime, APF personnel are deployed at border outposts, equipped with modern surveillance technology and trained to address a wide range of protection challenges. The Border Security Department has also focused on fostering cooperation with the border governing agencies of neighbouring countries by having bi-lateral meeting at various operational and command level. Joint initiatives, such as coordinated border patrols and intelligence-sharing programs with neighboring counterparts, have become integral to tackling transnational threats more effectively.

To strengthen border security and combat cross-border crimes, the department has adopted a multifaceted method. This includes enhancing intelligence gathering and analysis, improving border infrastructure and deploying advanced surveillance systems, including a digitalized border management system. Additionally, APF, Nepal is engaging in community outreach programs aimed at fostering cooperation with local border communities. Through these varied and collaborative efforts, the Armed Police Force, Nepal remains committed to securing Nepal's borders and ensuring national peace, stability and sovereignty.
