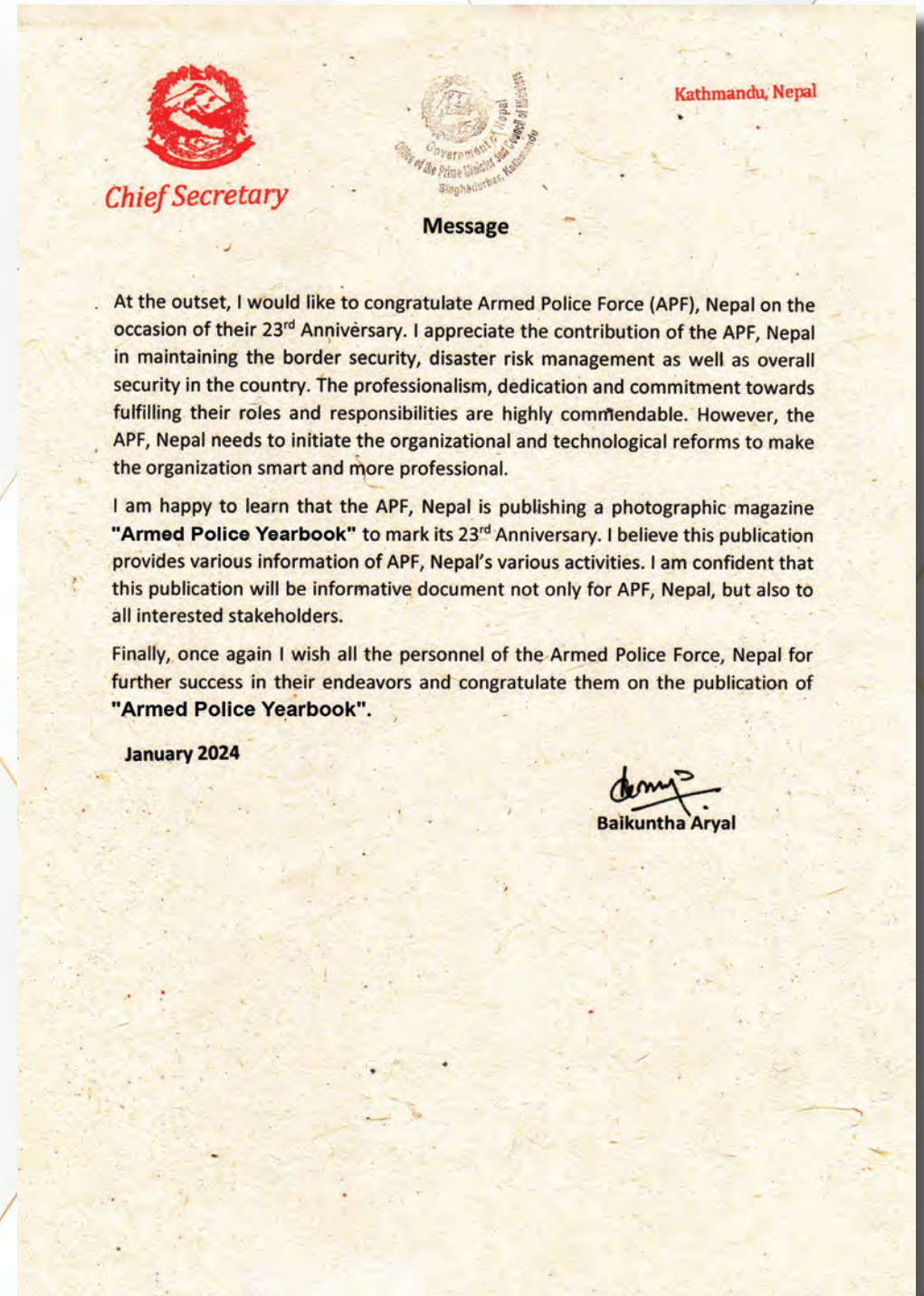

The Armed Police Force, Nepal is the first line of defense in the country, protecting the sovereignty of the country, preventing transborder crime, smuggling and any other illegal activities, unauthorize entry into or exit from territory of Nepal, contribution in revenue support and thus making important contribution to strengthening national security.

Among the multiple mandates tasked to Armed Police Force, Nepal, to specialize people's service and security, organization has prioritized BIRD concept in which Border Security and Revenue support falls under the responsibilities of Border Security Department.

Security and protecting border have been priority mission for Border Security Department. Armed Police Force, Nepal at first initiated border security by the deployment of troops in custom office, later was further expanded by establishing Border Out Post (BOPs) in 2006. At present, Armed Police Force, Nepal as a dedicated force in border security, has its footprints in border with 252 Border Out Posts.

Border Security Department monitors, supervises and guides brigades in provinces, mainly focused in the physical security of international borders, neutralizes cross border crime, assists in revenue support and promoting border area development plan by the awareness program. It also has a close coordination with counter parts border forces with a different mechanism from central level to field level.

The department focuses research-based problem- solving, record keeping and management of different border related documents through Border Resource and Research Center (BRRC).
